RAFAEL & FE ANGULO GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

In May 2008, the Association of Hispanic Alumni of the University of Florida held the 5th Annual Gator Guayabera Guateque. Held in Coral Gables, this celebration's purpose was to raise funds to benefit the Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures and continue the Association of Hispanic Alumni Scholarship Program. Due to the generosity of alumni, students and friends, the Association bestowed a \$45,000 donation at the Gator Guayabera Encore in October 2008, of which \$12,400 has been designated towards scholarship awards for UF students.

Description: The Rafael & Fe Angulo Graduate Award is a merit based scholarship given to recognize two University of Florida undergraduate students who will enroll at UF for graduate studies in the Fall of 2009, and/or current graduate students enrolled at UF for graduate studies. Students must excel in leadership, service and/or academic scholarship and who have made a positive impact on the Hispanic-Latino community. Two graduate scholarships in the amount of \$750 each will be awarded.

Eligibility:

- ◆ Must be a currently enrolled University of Florida student who graduated in December 2008 or will be graduating in Spring 2009 or Summer 2009. Graduate students currently working on their Master's or PhD at UF.
- ◆ Must be a degree seeking, graduate or professional student enrolled at the University of Florida in Fall 2009. Students who are still awaiting admission decisions from UF should apply now and award recipients will be required to show proof of enrollment in Fall 2009 for disbursement of scholarship.
- ◆ Scholarship is for UF students only. Scholarship is non-transferable to another institution.
- ◆ Recipients may begin their UF graduate study in Summer 2009. However, eligibility for and disbursement of scholarship is based on Fall 2009 enrollment.

- ◆ Essay and Short Answer Response
- ◆ Resume
- ◆ A current University of Florida official transcript (no photocopies accepted) which documents a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.7 on a 4.0 scale on all credits.
- ◆ 2 Letters of Recommendation
